Second Grade - Art

Students should know and be able to demonstrate mastery in the following skills by the end of Second Grade:

- Know the differences between materials, techniques, and processes.
- Describe how different materials, techniques, and processes cause different responses.
- Use different media, techniques, and processes to communicate ideas, experiences, and stories.
- Use art materials and tools in a safe and responsible manner.
- Understand and use similarities and differences between characteristics of the visual arts and other arts disciplines
- Identify connections between the visual arts and other disciplines in the curricula
- Relate artistic ideas and works with societal, cultural and historical context to deepen understanding.
- Create works of art about events in home, school or community life.
- Generate and conceptualize artistic ideas and work.
- Brainstorm multiple approaches to art and design.
- Use of various materials to make art.
- With prompting and support, describe the relationship between illustrations and the story in which they appear (e.g., what moment in a story an illustration depicts).
- Confirm understanding of a text read aloud or information presented orally or through other media by asking and answering questions about key details and requesting clarification if something is not understood.
- Organize and develop artistic ideas and work.
- Explore materials to explore personal interests in art-making.
- Demonstrate safe use/cleaning.
- Repurpose objects into something new.
- Refine and complete artistic work.
- Discuss/reflect with peers about choices when creating artwork.
