

Parent-Teacher Organization 9/9/2026 Minutes

- 6:05 pm - Call to Order & Pledge of Allegiance spoken by All
- 6:06 pm- Introductions given by Stacey Salsavage, Maggie Cibello, Jessica Wallace, Taylor Macklin, Mrs. Soroka, Mrs. Oboyle, and Mrs. Milkelski.
- 6:08 pm- Treasurer's Report: Jessica Wallace, Treasurer; no questions were asked.
- Committee Reports.
- 6:12 pm- Marissa Mckenna gave an introduction on her role and reported on the party planning for the year class parties. Spoke of upcoming party on 10/30 from 8:30 am-11:30 am reporting that the letters for parents to volunteer will be sent home soon. Spoke of the importance of needing clearances and how to submit them to the front desk. No questions were asked.
- 6:15 pm- Dine N Donate Stacey Woznock spoke of her role. States that right now there are no scheduled dine and donates but will have them at the ones that had a good turnout, Texas Roadhouse, 5 below, Chicka Filet, and Gerrys Pizza. Spoke of the idea of selling Texas Roadhouse gift cards and if a \$5,000 limit is hit, Texas Roadhouse will donate a pizza party to the class who sold the most; no questions were asked.
- 6:18 pm – Stacey Salsavage spoke of the box top program and provided QR codes and ways to easily attach Amazon and Walmart accounts to a box top program.
- 6:21pm – Maggie Cibello spoke of how bingos work and focused on upcoming Toy Bingo on 12/13. Maggie explained ways to get volunteer hours, how to donate toys to the event, and the exchange of raffle tickets, 5 per toy. Expressed this can be a way for those who can't do during school volunteer hours to get hours. Explained that tickets will be sold at a later date and that a sign-up genius for volunteering, food, and toys will be available at that time too; no questions were asked.
